

10	Henstridge:	So is he – when was the last time you spoke to him?
11 12	Dunphy:	Oh god boy, I don't know. It could be – he worked with us with – with the Department of Highways.
13	Henstridge:	Uhmuhm.
14 15 16	Dunphy:	How long was that was now. Cause $I - I$ think I retired at the time he went to work over there. Or he was there when I was there. He was there for a while when I was there, okay. I retired in 201.

19	Henstridge:	It was fourteen years ago.
20	Dunphy:	Yeah.
21	Henstridge:	And he was working there then?
22 23	Dunphy:	He was there then for – sort – you know, for a few years. He might have got a couple of years out of it.

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1 Henstridge: Okay. And what's he been doin' in the last few years, work wise?

2 **Dunphy:** Didn't. He didn't work.

- Henstridge: Okay. Did he have any disputes or anything that you're aware of? Any –
   any problems that he had that he was concerned about? I noticed the
   sign when I went into the house there.
- 6 **Dunphy:** Yeah.
- 7 Henstridge: Something to do with Workers' Compensation or.
- 8 **Dunphy:** Oh yeah.
- 9 Henstridge: What can you tell me about that?

10Dunphy:Sure we wouldn't know much about it really. I know we use to hear him11on Open Line talking about – he used to be on Open Line he'd be talking12about his family and all this. Different things like that. One time he was13on Open Line, I shouldn't – he was talking about the – the – he – R- RNC14had stopped him in St. John's, in Mount Pearl area see, and they stopped15him. He had dope on him. But he said they were fine fellows, they let him16go ahead.

- 17 **Henstridge:** Okay.
- 18 **Dunphy:** So sort of a thing.
- 19 Henstridge: Okay.
- 20 **Dunphy:** But that never happened.
- Henstridge: You don't think it happened.
- 22 Dunphy: No.
- 23 **Henstridge:** Why do you say that?

1 2	Dunphy:	Cause they never let him go. Why would they let him (background voices) What?
3	Henstridge:	Yeah. So you don't remember the last time you spoke to your brother or?
4	Dunphy:	No, it's were – good many years.
5	Henstridge:	Okay. Did he have issues with you guys? Is – is that
6	Dunphy:	Ah, not real – well he use to bring it on himself sort of a thing.
7 8	Henstridge:	Uhm. Cause I don't know him at all. So I don't know anything that's going on.
9	Dunphy:	No.
10 11	Henstridge:	So any information we can get as to what might happened there. An, you know, did he have issues with the police for example that you're aware of?
12	Dunphy:	Not really.
13	Henstridge:	No.
14	Dunphy:	No.
15 16	Henstridge:	He never ever expressed any concern about the authorities or the police or
17	Dunphy:	No.
18 19	Henstridge:	You said that the Officer – so the Officer came and you said that he was speaking to your wife and then you kind of walked in.
20	Dunphy:	Uhm.
21 22	Henstridge:	And he asked – your only conversation had to do with guns, is that right or?

- Dunphy: Well that's about it, yeah. He asked me I was there listening to what he
   was saying ...
- 3 Henstridge: Uhm.
- 4 Dunphy: ... (unintel)... when he was talking to her. And then he said to me would –
   5 would he have a gun in the house ...
- 6 Henstridge: Uhm...uhm.
- 7 **Dunphy:** ... sort of a thing but I I I said I didn't know and I didn't think he would 8 but ...
- 9 Henstridge: Did you mention to him about the fact that ...
- 10 **Dunphy:** No, not that one.
- 11 Henstridge: Okay.
- 12 **Dunphy:** No. Thought of that after.
- 13 Henstridge: Oh, okay, fair enough.
- 14 **Dunphy:** He was gone then.
- Henstridge: Fair enough. Yeah. And do you have any idea or any theory as to what
   might have happened over there today? Anything that ...
- 17 **Dunphy:** No, cause we didn't know he was he was he was kind he was kind of 18 away from us, see, but he was giving us a lot of trouble there years ago.
- 19 **Henstridge:** Like what?
- 20Dunphy:Like about everything going on.Like the land down there across the road21and he use to bring the old junk over and dump it old cars, on the on22the side of the road where you're parked down here.
- 23 Henstridge: Okay.

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- 1 **Dunphy:** You know, that went on for a while.
- 2 Henstridge: Yeah. And you haven't had any conversation with him in in a while.
- 3 **Dunphy:** No.
- 4 Henstridge: How can you estimate how long? Has it been ...
- 5 **Dunphy:** Jeepers boy. Allow it been ten years.
- 6 **Henstridge:** Is that right?
- 7 **Dunphy:** Yeah.
- 8 Henstridge: Okay. Is he a older brother or younger brother?
- 9 **Dunphy:** Younger.
- Henstridge: Younger brother. Has he is he do you know if he's ever been treated
   for any mental illness or anything like that?
- 12 **Dunphy:** No.
- 13 Henstridge: No.
- 14 **Dunphy:** Cause no, he wasn't, no.
- 15 Henstridge: Okay. Okay.
- 16 **Dunphy:** He got broke up one time, I don't know if you knew that, in St. John's ...
- 17 Henstridge: Oh.
- 18 **Dunphy:** ... when a machine squat him or something. A loader.
- 19 Henstridge: Okay. How long ago was that?
- 20 **Dunphy:** That's boy, it could be twenty years or more.

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- Henstridge: Alright. So were you aware that he -- is he -- was he on Workers'
   Compensation? Is that ...
- 3 **Dunphy:** Oh yeah.
- 4 Henstridge: He was, was he?
- 5 **Dunphy:** Yeah.
- 6 Henstridge: Okay.
- 7 **Dunphy:** I suppose.
- 8 **Henstridge:** Alright.
- 9 **Dunphy:** He was living on something.
- 10 **Henstridge:** Who did he you and him haven't had a very good relationship by the 11 sounds of it. Does he have any family around that he's close with?
- 12 **Dunphy:** No.
- 13 Henstridge: No.
- 14 **Dunphy:** No, we was there's three of us.
- 15 Henstridge: Yeah.
- 16 **Dunphy:** One fellow is up here and one fellow is in Seal Cove.
- 17 Henstridge: Okay.
- 18Dunphy:Just you just couldn't go you couldn't go and deal with him, eh. You19couldn't trust him, eh, cause you didn't know what he had over there. We20couldn't go around the place.

21 Henstridge: What do you mean?

- Dunphy: We wouldn't go over around cause you didn't know what was there, you
   know, with him.
- 3 Henstridge: Like what?
- 4 Dunphy: Well it could be any you don't know cause the way he used to be right –
  5 he'd be right out of it, eh. Like he'd froth out of the mouth and every
  6 ...(unintel)... Me brother went over one time, ...(unintel) ... and that's
  7 when father died, my god, he said, you couldn't talk to him.
- 8 Henstridge: No.
- 9 Dunphy: No. No.
- 10 Henstridge: Have you ever known him to be violent with anybody in the family?
- 11 **Dunphy:** What do you mean like?
- 12 **Henstridge:** Fighting. Threaten.
- 13 **Dunphy:** Oh no.
- 14 **Henstridge:** Anything like that.
- 15 **Dunphy:** Well he threatened ya. Well she he threatened the wife, you know.
- 16 Henstridge: Did she?
- 17 **Dunphy:** Oh yes.
- 18 Henstridge: Whe how...
- 19 **Dunphy:** She'll tell you that.
- Henstridge: Okay. Okay. And so your you haven't had any contact and you're not
   sure who in the family he's close enough with to talk ...
- 22 **Dunphy:** Nobody.

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Henstridge: How about his daughter? 1 2 Dunphy: I don't know. 3 **Henstridge:** Do you guys have any contact with her or? 4 Dunphy: No. Well she'll speak to us if we come across her, you know. But she didn't - she never did come around the - here. 5 6 Henstridge: Okay. 7 Dunphy: She did one time but so – when her mother died and they – you know, she 8 - she was still coming over to the house but then - I think when Father died, when all this racket, he was - he was right out of it altogether like 9 causing trouble for everybody. 10 11 Henstridge: Uhm...uhm. Your Father, did he live in that house? Dunphy: No, over here. 12 Henstridge: Okay. So your brother has always lived in this house? 13 Dunphy: Yeah. 14 Henstridge: Okay. Okay. Steve? 15 16 Burke: Ah, just for the record, it's it's ah Steve Burke with the Major Crime Unit. Ah, the firearm, the twenty-two .... 17 Dunphy: Yeah. 18 Burke: ... can you give us like a detailed description of that – that firearm, what 19 you can remember, colors, length and do you have any paper work on it. 20 No, not them times. Them times, jeez, you didn't have to have 'em Dunphy: 21 registered. At that time we were supposed to get 'em registered, I think, at 22

the time. But I don't know if I told someone that we had this one and then

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	that – and the two shotguns. But I never did get the – the twenty-two or – we called it a twenty-two.

- Dunphy: Uhm, he was going to doctors. He went to buddy in Holyrood, ... (unintel)
   Wells... Paul Wells. Fell out with him and then he ended up in Trepassey
   to McGary ... (phonetic) ...
- 18 Henstridge: Okay.
- 19 **Dunphy:** That's the way he was.
- 20 Burke: Do you know what issues he had there?
- 21 **Dunphy:** What?
- 22 **Burke:** Do you know what issue what kind of medical issues he had?

- Dunphy: The medical issues that he had is trying to get on Workers' but he he did
   get broke up but then he went to work in Bull Arm after that. He was
   working in Bull Arm.
- 4 **Burke:** Okay.
- 5 Henstridge: And his wife passed away. Is that ...
- 6 **Dunphy:** Yeah.
- 7 Henstridge: How long ago is that?
- 8 **Dunphy:** Boy jeepers, I don't know.
- 9 **Burke:** Were they together over there?
- 10 **Dunphy:** Yeah. Could be twenty-five years.
- 11 **Henstridge:** Oh, it's been quite some time, eh.
- Dunphy: Cause Meghan, I don't know how old the girl is now see, his daughter.
  She was only young.
- 14 Henstridge: Okay.
- 15 **Burke:** That the only child they got?
- 16 **Dunphy:** Yeah. ...(background voices) ...
- Henstridge: You remember what time the Officer came by today? If you don't that's
   fine.
- 19 **Dunphy:** No.
- 20 **Henstridge:** I'll ask your wife anyway.
- 21 **Dunphy:** Yeah, it was after lunch. I so it could be one o'clock. I don't know.
- 22 Henstridge: Okay, that's fine.

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- 1 **Dunphy:** I'd be only guessing. Yeah.
- 2 **Burke:** You say you fell out with your brother. Is there anything that ...
- 3 **Dunphy:** We didn't fall out with him. We just couldn't deal with him. He couldn't ...
- 4 **Burke:** Okay.
- 5 **Dunphy:** ... okay, that's the way he was, eh.
- 6 **Burke:** There was there major event that lead to that or just ...
- 7 **Dunphy:** No, no.
- 8 **Burke:** ... over time?
- 9 Dunphy: Just that well you couldn't you couldn't talk to really. Everybody
   10 owned him something.
- 11 **Henstridge:** Everybody owed him something.
- 12 **Dunphy:** Yeah.
- 13 Henstridge: Okay.
- 14 **Dunphy:** That's what he thought, I think.

15 **Henstridge:** Okay.

- 16 **Dunphy:** Too bad though isn't it.
- 17 **Henstridge:** Yes it is. It is too bad.
- Burke: Ah, is there anyone we can speak to that would have been closer to your
  brother? Ah, did he have any friends, relatives, that he communicated
  with on a regular basis?
- 21 **Dunphy:** Yeah, one of his drug buddies.

- 1 Henstridge: Who was that?
- 2 **Dunphy:** Ah, Col Colin Dinn
- 3 Henstridge: Colin Dean
- 4 **Dunphy:** Dinn
- 5 Henstridge: Dinn
- 6 Burke: Dinn. D-I-N-N.
- 7 **Dunphy:** D-E-A-N. Is it Dinn. Oh, it could be D-I-N.
- 8 Henstridge: Okay.
- 9 **Dunphy:** It's not Dean. I'd be ... (unintel) ... D-E-A-N. Dinn yeah. D-I-N.
- 10 Henstridge: Does he live here?
- 11 **Dunphy:** Cause he what.
- 12 **Henstridge:** He lives here.
- 13 **Dunphy:** Lives up the road.
- 14 Henstridge: Okay.
- 15 **Dunphy:** Don't go saying this now. He called him about two o'clock.
- 16 **Henstridge:** Who called?
- 17 **Dunphy:** ...(unintel) ... Don.
- 18 Henstridge: Don called?
- 19Dunphy:This fellow Dinn. He was gonna be home a certain time, eh. Don't go say20I said that.

- Henstridge: No, no. We don't have to say that. How did you know that he called him
   about two o'clock?
- 3 **Dunphy:** Someone told us. Someone who was talking to him this fellow.
- 4 **Henstridge:** Oh okay.
- 5 Burke: Today.
- 6 **Dunphy:** Yeah.
- 7 Burke: Okay.
- Henstridge: Let me ask you this, sir. When you found out what happened, how what
   was your reaction to what happened? Were you surprised by all of this
   or?
- 11 **Dunphy:** Not really.
- 12 Henstridge: Really.
- 13 **Dunphy:** No.
- 14 **Henstridge:** Why do you say that?
- 15 **Dunphy:** She'll tell you all about it when she comes down.
