314	DINN:	Come, yeah
315	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Come for me someday or something like that

343	DINN:	Not able to work, twenty four, seven pain

345	DINN:	It's madness
346	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Yeah
347	DINN:	Lost everything, had to move back to Newfoundland
348	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Yeah
349 350	DINN:	Wicked, I knows what he went through, like, I, I can sympathize with a lot of it
351	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	You guys had that in common, hey
352	DINN:	Yeah
353	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	M'hmm
354	DINN:	Right
355	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Yeah
356	DINN:	It's not something good to have in common, but
357	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	No ,
358	DINN:	You know
359 360 361	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Ahm, and I don't know if I asked you this question, did he have any issues with the police per say, did you ever hear him, cause I mean a lot of people don't like cops but

362 363 364	DINN:	Well, no real issues I s'pose, years ago there used to be a fella, DECKER, was it, he had trouble, like, back in the eighties say

366 367	DINN:	Stuff like that, he got caught a few times for weed and stuff, he got searched a few times on the Salmonier Line and
368	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Yeah
369 370 371 372	DINN:	But he never really, like, singled out anybody to, he didn't like cops in general but then when he got his license, that's why he didn't like cops right cause he used to smoke weed all day, every day because of his
373	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Yeah
374	DINN:	Situation
375 376	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	So the issues he had with the police was before he got the license
377 378	DINN:	Yes and then after he got his license he got searched a couple of times but he had the license
379	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Right
380	DINN:	And he never told 'em
381	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	He never told them he had a license
382 383	DINN:	Until then right and then he did, like, once they searched everything
384	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Right
385 386 387	DINN:	And found it and then he showed them the license and they left him alone after that, that's, now that's what he told me right, I was never personally with him or involved in

389	DINN:	Any of his dealings with the cops or nothing
390	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Okay
391 392	DINN:	I used to go there probably, oh I used to go down and plow the snow in his driveway any time we had storms
393	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	M'hmm
394 395 396 397 398 399 400 401	DINN:	And to go visit him, I used to go around seven, seven thirty in the evening and most times you couldn't even get in to see him because when you get there, by that time of the evening, he'd have all the lights off and he'd be lying down, every evening, now sometimes if I got there before he laid down, he'd stay up for hours but if there was nobody around see, I think that was a lot of it he spent a lot of time alone, a lot of time alone

403 404 405	DINN:	Well because of being, like, how do I put this, it was pretty much the same routine, like, every week kind of thing, right, he'd have maybe two good days
406	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	M'hmm
407 408 409 410 411 412 413	DINN:	And then the rest would be bad days with whatever, whatever medical stuff he had wrong with him, right, like, I often went there and he'd be, like, leaning over the arm of a chair, driving it into his stomach trying to get gas to pass through him to get rid of headaches and, like, he used to pass blood and, like, it was unreal man the stuff, the poor fucker
414	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	M'hmm

415 416	DINN:	But after he passed blood and stuff, that's what he used to tell me, he said fill the toilet he said with blood
417	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	M'hmm
418 419	DINN:	And then he was good for two days and then it'd start again, right
420	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Yeah
421 422	DINN:	It was just a vicious cycle, now his doctor, Dr. McGARRY was trying to help him out as much as he could, like, doing
423	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Yeah
424 425 426 427 428 429	DINN:	Checking stuff but he used to go to doctors out in Holyrood, there, Dr. WALSH and one in town, he wasn't getting nowhere so he switched, he went down to McGARRY and he had all kinds of tests done and he had a couple operations, he was feeling better and he was able to do more, that's only in the last year

431	DINN:	Like
432 433 434 435	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	That's what I was gonna ask ya, in the last, you know, few weeks, months, whatever, is there anything that you've noticed about his behaviour, his attitude that would indicate things were getting out of control
436 437 438 439 440	DINN:	No, he was getting better, like, medically and physically feeling better, his color come back, he gained a bit of weight, like, he was gone away to nothing there for a while man, he looked like the picture of death and whatever, what'd they do with him, gallbladder, maybe, what did he do
441	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	And that surgery seemed to help

442 443 444 445	DINN:	The first surgery helped for about a week and then he started getting sick again so they went through and they found something else, whatever, oh my, I should pay more attention
446	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	That's alright
447	DINN:	To words
448 449	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	That's alright, my understanding was that he talked a lot so you can't be expected to remember every word that he said
450	DINN:	Oh, it continuous.
451	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Yeah
452	DINN:	Like, you'd have a job to get a word in edge wise sometimes
453	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Yeah
454	DINN:	Once he got going on something, right
455	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	So there was no indicators to you that
456	DINN:	No this just blows me away buddy
457	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	What, ah
458	DINN:	I never expected
459 460	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	What's your understanding, what do you think happened in that house
461	DINN:	Yesterday
462	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Yeah
463 464 465	DINN:	I have no idea, I really don't unless, I, I don't know, he went down two o'clock, like, he passed my house at quarter to two so he was only just home whenever this cop showed up

466	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	Yeah
467	DINN:	He had to be just home
468	CPL. HENSTRIDGE:	And you were never aware of any firearms
469	DINN:	Never, no sir, no, not a bit
