**Report:**

At approximately 14:30 on 2015/04/04 writer heard a dispatch to Holyrood members that there was a report of shots fired in Mitchell's Brook/ Mt Carmel area. It was further reported that there was a Royal Newfoundland Constabulary member involved. It was reported that an ambulance was dispatched. It was unclear at that time what the extent, if any, that the injuries might be. The dispatch was that the RNC member needed immediate assistance at that scene.

Writer contacted Cst COX once the radio was clear and it was confirmed for writer to start heading that way to assist.

Writer contacted Cst WILLIAMS while enroute to inform him that he may be needed to assist at the scene or to cover calls for both Ferryland and Holyrood while members dealt with the incident. As WILLIAMS was actually closer than writer then WILLIAMS continued to dispatch address. Both members were at that point covering both Ferryland and Holyrood but positioning to assist as needed.

Member continued to monitor radio transmissions to ensure that the risk assessment and needs were not changing. At several points writer updated both Cst COX and Cpl O'Keefe that members were enroute.

At approximately 15:15 writer arrived on scene and spoke to Cpl O'Keefe. Writer assisted with traffic until it was decided to transport SMYTH to the Holyrood detachment.

16:10 Writer left with SMYTH.

16:20 Writer stopped for gas at the local North Atlantic station.

During the transport the conversation was limited to writer and SMYTH talking about where they were from, how long they had been in each service and the people that they knew in each others respective forces.

Writer did not question SMYTH on any aspects of the incident.

At one point writer mentioned that he knew SMYTH from various officer bulletins that he had read that SMYTH put out while in CID. Writer asked if SMYTH was still in CID.

SMYTH then stated that he was part of the Close Protective unit. He said that was what brought him there as there were threats on social media. Writer did not question it further. SMYTH went on to say that it was a JFO unit and mentioned an RCMP member that was on the unit.

SMYTH at one point stated. "no matter how confident you are about diffusing a situation it is different when it happens". " Only had time to say no, no, no, and that was it".

Writer quickly diverted the conversation away from the comments and back to years of service general conversation.

Writer arrived at the detachment and met S/Sgt TILLER at the back door and SMYTH went with him and several RNC members.

22:15 Writer attended the scene as he was requested to do scene security. Writer took over for Cst Cox at this time. Writer maintained the scene log until approximately 8:15 when he turned it over to Cpl O'KEEFE.

There were no concerns during this time.

08:37 Writer departed the scene.
