Nippard: What time is it now. 3:11 on April 7th, Tuesday. My name is Constable

Nippard and your name ...

3 **Sullivan:** Constable War ...

4 **Nippard:** ... what's your ...

5 **Sullivan:** Constable Warren Sullivan.

6 **Nippard:** Constable Warren Sullivan...

7 **Sullivan:** Yeah.

8 **Nippard:** Okay. I didn't know your – i didn't your rank cause ...

9 **Sullivan:** Yeah.

10 **Nippard:** ... cause Joe was a Sergeant wasn't he?

11 **Sullivan:** Joey. I think. I think, Sergeant, yeah.

12 **Nippard:** Yeah, that's what I think ...

13 Sullivan: Yeah.

14 **Nippard:** ... Mike Adams said earlier.

15 **Sullivan:** Yeah.

Nippard: You can just start from, ah, jeez, I'm all caught up. Start from the

beginning. Just whenever you ...

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1 **Sullivan:** Sure.

2 **Nippard:** ... became aware of it ...

3 **Sullivan:** Yeah, absolutely.

4 **Nippard:** ... and – and what you did from there.

5 **Sullivan:** Early afternoon, of course, I didn't – I didn't – I don't keep notes regards to

Association matters so I'll – I guess I'll state for the record that I am

President of the RNC Association.

8 Nippard: Okay.

9 **Sullivan:** So, ah, anytime there's any incidents or issues of subsequent – of – of

consequence I usually receive a call from the Chief of Police.

11 **Nippard:** Okay.

Sullivan: And early – early Sunday afternoon, Easter Sunday, I received a call from

the Chief advising that one of our officers was involved, Joe Smyth, was

involved in a – in an incident where, ah, there was, ah, ah, shots fired, a

police related shooting, that – that Smyth was okay and he was basically

still at the scene and that the RCMP were – were on scene or on their way

to the scene at the time. So ...

18 Nippard: Yeah.

19 **Sullivan:** ... very good. So, ah, ah, you know, I said, you have any other

information. No, I don't have – really don't have anything. So, ah, I then

tried to contact Joe – Joey, and, ah, couldn't get through obviously so l

said, you know, he's – he's down in Mark ...(phonetic) ... Carmel – Mount

Carmel somewhere obviously the cell phone coverage is pretty bad. So,

24 ah, what I did is I – I sent him a text and, you know, said are you okay or –

and what have you. So then he – he text me back and he said coverage

is bad, right. So I said well at least – well spotty or what – what have you.

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1	Nippard:	Yeah.
2 3 4	Sullivan:	So I said well call me when you can. So, ah, short while after he called and I said are you okay, who's there, is there anybody with you, so on and so forth. So he just advised that there, you know, ah, the RCMP were on
5		the scene, he was alone in the – in the vehicle there.
6	Nippard:	Uhm.
7 8 9 10 11	Sullivan:	So I said, look boy, you know, ah, do you need anything, you know, what have you? I – I said, you know, can, you know, ah, you know, we'll – we'll get somebody out to you or something just to, you know, get a familiar face out. I said, Joey, whatever you need like it's good, right. So anyway he said, yeah, he said, well I'm not quite sure what's gonna happen here and then just as he was speaking to me one of the officers at the scene
13	Nippard:	Okay.
14 15 16 17	Sullivan:	he poked his head in through the window. I could hear him. He said, hey Joe; what we're gonna do is we're gonna bring you back to Holyrood and he said, you know, let you sit back there and, you know, kind of be able to relax a little tiny bit and
18	Nippard:	Yeah.
19 20 21 22	Sullivan:	you know, wait until we do what we gotta do, type of thing. So – so I said, okay I'm on my way, said we're on our way out. He said, yeah, apparently Mike Adams and – and – well Mike Adams is on his way. So then I learned that Mike and Reg Tilley
23	Nippard:	Yeah.
24 25	Sullivan:	were on their way to Holyrood. I scooped up a – was our – well Scott Harris is our Treasurer
26	Nippard:	Okay.

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1	Sullivan:	on our immediate Executive.	So we headed out.	Basically the role –

we – we headed out to fill was that of nothing but just support for him ...

3 Nippard: Uhm.

4 Sullivan: ... to have a familiar face around him and to let him know, say, listen, you

5 know, whatever you need ...

6 Nippard: Yeah.

7 **Sullivan:** ... we'll be here for you, you know, all – long haul, right.

8 Nippard: Yeah.

9 Sullivan: So when I got there – we got in Holyrood, you know, around five-

thirtyish...

11 Nippard: Okay.

12 **Sullivan:** Right. And, ah, so weren't there overly long, maybe an hour or so. A little

over an hour, maybe two. But, ah, so, ah, met the guys, the investigative

team at the room. Introduced myself, number one. Ah, met Monty ...

15 Nippard: Uhm.

Sullivan: ... and so he said you wanna go down and speak to – speak to the boys,

fine, he said, and probably we'll have a chat a little later. I said, yeah fine.

So I went down and Mike and Reg were doin' the, you know, the EA part

of it, you know, just, you know, ensuring Joey, you know, doing their thing.

20 Nippard: Yeah.

21 **Sullivan:** Right.

22 **Nippard:** Yeah.

23 **Sullivan:** So, you know, just trying to ...

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1 **Nippard:** They're critical, ah, ...

2 Sullivan: ... be ...

3 **Nippard:** ...critical ...(unintel) ... incidents.

4 Sullivan: Right. And that's ...

5 Nippard: Yeah.

6 **Sullivan:** ... just the first stages of that.

7 Nippard: Yeah.

8 Sullivan: I'm not trained in it.

9 **Nippard:** Yeah.

Sullivan: But I know it's - you know, it's the first stages of it and - and then to me

that was my biggest concern is making sure or ensuring that he was okay,

that he knew that he had some support here and that, you know, going

forward, right.

14 Nippard: Yeah.

Sullivan: And he was so – so badly wanting to tell his story to – to the boys, right,

16 to...

17 **Nippard:** Yeah.

Sullivan: ... you know, to – to – to the investigators, the investigative team.

19 Nippard: Yeah.

21

20 **Sullivan:** But it – but to be quite honest with you I, you know, I said, look Joey, this –

this – like from what looked – what we've learned and what we know with

critical incident stress and everything else is best, you know, the best...

Yeah.

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1	Nippard:	The best
2	Sullivan:	for you is to step back here now and try to relax, try to get some of this adrenalin out of your system
4	Nippard:	Yeah.
5	Sullivan:	right. He – he was shaking and, you know, he was doing it all, right.
6	Nippard:	Yeah.
7	Sullivan:	So, ah, anyway he settled down a bit and so he said, you know what, he
8		said, if you – if that's what you recommend, he said you know, if the boys
9		were okay with it, fine. So now he did - so, of course, he's still wanting to
10		tell his story so we're getting a little bit – little bit and a little bit and I was
11		trying to basically, you know – we were trying to say look Joey, you don't
12		need to – you don't need to talk, you know, tell your story as such. You
13		don't have to tell the story and I was talking about everything. Like
14	•	whatever I could think of to talk about other than
15	Nippard:	Other than the incident.
16	Sullivan:	the incident, right.
17	Nippard:	Yeah.
18	Sullivan:	But, of course, he did – but he did allude to the fact that he was down
19		doing a – a, you know, an assessment, a threat assessment, that
20		individual had, you know, who had, you know, ah, made some threats and
21		- I'm not even quite sure if he said it was on Twitter or what it was. But
22		anyway it was – that was what he had said. He had done this
23		assessment. When he got there buddy wasn't home. And I – I got a
24		Coles' notes version. So he went – he went next door, spoke with the
25		brother and his wife, I think his brother's wife

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Sullivan: ... and he said, went back and he said I was like thirty seconds from -1 2 from being out of there. Like is - you know, could have been gone, left 3 the scene and he said - he said the guy was home so, he said, ah, went up, identified myself, went in and spoke to him he said and knew nothing, I 4 was making a note in the, you know, making a note in my file folder and 5 he said the next thing I got hit, he's putting a gun at me and I reacted. 6 7 Nippard: Yeah. Sullivan: 8 So I said, look, you know, just – look what you – what you did, look everybody's okay with it. You know, you're gonna be - you're gonna be 9 okay. You know, you're doing - you did the right thing, we're - we're glad 10 that you're here and, you know, we kept reassuring him and saying, look, 11 we're just glad that you're here and we're glad that we don't have to go 12 home and, you know, tell your wife that things turned out in a whole 13 14 different, you know, a whole different scenario, a whole different end 15 result, right so. And that's pretty much it with regard what he had said to 16 us. Nippard: Okay. 17 18 Sullivan: And, ah, so again we just kept talking about whatever under the sun, right. We're talking about old Association days cause him and I were on the 19 20 Executive together. We were talking about a day out around a cabin and you know just things – just generalities. I wanted to try to get him get his 21 mind off of exactly what had just occurred even though ... 22 Yeah. 23 Nippard: Sullivan: ... next to impossible, of course right. 24 Nippard: Yeah. 25 Sullivan: 26 But that's mainly our roles, you know, was supportive and, you know, and 27 that's - that's what it was. And then he did make a - he made a comment

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1		a little later than, and you know, I - and I - I think it's - it's natural but, ah,
2		after he - he calmed down pretty good and then all of a sudden he said,
3		you know, man, he said, I'm mad at him now. He said I'm made. He said
4		like - he said if I could only shake him alive now, he said, and - and - and
5		slap him and say, you know, what the fuck you doin' this – what boy –
6		what did you do. What'd you do this for, right? You know what I mean.
7	Nippard:	Yeah.
8	Sullivan:	So. And I said, you know what that's perfectly normal what you feel here
9		now, you know, and it – it's okay. I mean, you wanna – you know, you
10		wanna talk about it like that, that's fine too. And
	A11	
11	Nippard:	Yeah.
12	Sullivan:	but you know whatever you wanna do, Joe, right. Whatever you wanna
13		do, so.
14	Nippard:	Yeah.
15	Sullivan:	And that's what we did basically the whole time we were there.

16	Nippard:	Yeah.
17	Sullivan:	Until then, of course, ah, well Mike and Reg had left. They had left up,
18		you know, to that point and, you know, they concluded what they were
19		doing. Just wanted to ensure Joey was okay and we - and I said, look
20		Mike, whatever - however long he's gonna be here I'll just - I'll bring him
21		home, make sure he's gonna be okay for the evening and so and so forth,
22		so. So then I reached out to, ah, another member of ours, ah, Fred
23		
24	Nippard:	Okay.
25	Sullivan:	Fred was involved in an incident back in the 90's, ah, in Corner Brook.
26	Nippard:	Okay.

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So it was a police related shooting and it was a fatality and, ah. so I. Sullivan: 1 figured it'd be a great guy to reach out to be able to provide some support 2 for Joe, you know, over the coming days, weeks, months and, you know, 3 years, right. 4 Nippard: Yeah. 5 6 Sullivan: So I text – I text Fred and said look, I'm just here – here with Joey Smyth. He's been involved in an incident of which you're familiar with and I said I 7 think that it'd – you'd be a good resource for him now in the days to come, 8 I said, so I'd appreciate it if you, you know, if you wouldn't mind, you know, 9 reaching out to him. Whatever, he said, eh, not a problem. You know, 10 just give him my information and when the time is right and that's – that's 11 what he - so that's what I did. And Fred called me later then that evening 12 and we just had a chat, right, and said look, you know, he's – I said he 13 seems to be okay and blah, blah, blah. And then Fred was saying well 14 15 look this is what he's gonna – this is what he needs to expect. Tell him to stay away from the media. You know, tell him to not be listening to the 16 media. You know, he said, and, you know, so we just talked about a 17 couple of his experiences. 18 Nippard: Okay. 19 Sullivan: So that's – and that – that was it, right. So we provided, you know, pretty 20 much a support role for – for Joey there. And, ah, like I said, he did – he 21 did a lit – you know, he did make some – some comment. 22 Nippard: Okay. 23 24 Sullivan: But like I didn't – I didn't even, ah, never even – didn't even know the 25 gentleman's name, you know, right up 'til the point where I dropped Joey 26 off and – and I – I still didn't know the gentleman's name, who was 27 involved here or - or, you know, I didn't know how long he was - he was there or how long after or before. Like I had none of those details ... 28

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1 Nippard: Okay.

2 **Sullivan:** ... and then I guess some of this stuff is slowly coming out now, right.

3 Nippard: Yeah.

4 **Sullivan:** But.

5 **Nippard:** Did, ah, - did – was there anything and anything that he told you regards

to the incident that was alarming to you?

7 Sullivan: Not a thing.

8 **Nippard:** Nothing.

9 **Sullivan:** No.

10 Nippard: Okay.

Sullivan: Oth – oth – other than the fact that, you know, he – he point – he pointed a

gun at him.

13 **Nippard:** Yeah. Other than ...

14 **Sullivan:** You know what I mean. Like ...

15 **Nippard:** ... other than the obvious.

16 **Sullivan:** But nothing – no. Well I mean, if – look as a police officer ...

17 **Nippard:** Yeah.

Sullivan: ... I'll – you know, I'll be quite honest, as a police officer, it just sounded,

you know, it sounded text book to me. As, you know, in the wording here,

you know, who knows where my words will end up here but ...

21 **Nippard:** Uhm.

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1 2 3	Sullivan:	but it's what you consider to be, you know, justifiable and, you know, and – and he – he – he had no other choice. That was – and you know, that was – that was the – the immediate conclusion that we came to.
4	Nippard:	Yeah.
5 6 7 8 9	Sullivan:	You know I mean, based on this – this guy, his credibility, and he's very credible,(coughs) and you know, kno – knowing – knowing him personally, certainly, you know, that was – that was alarming to me. Just, you know, to me is that he was a lucky guy that he – he walked out of there that day.
10	Nippard:	Yeah.
11 12	Sullivan:	You know. But now other than that though it seemed to be pretty – pretty standard stuff for me.
13	Nippard:	Yeah.
14	Sullivan:	You know.
15 16	Nippard:	And I'm sure if this, I mean, like I said, we're just touching up with you guys just to see what your guys role were
17	Sullivan:	Yeah.
18 19 20 21	Nippard:	\dots and what you guys had talked about. And I'm sure if it was R – if it was, you know, if it was my partner I'd be doing, or even if I somebody that I knew in the Force, I'd be doing the same thing, going out there to the scene and just to \dots
22	Sullivan:	The same
23	Nippard:	just like you said, give 'em a familiar face and
24	Nippard:	Yeah.

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1 **Nippard:** ... try to give 'em some comfort, tell 'em – give 'em whatever they need,

2 right.

3 **Sullivan:** Yeah. We – we let the guys know. We ...(unintel) ...

4 Nippard: Yeah.

5 **Sullivan:** ... who we were and like what the purpose was and...

6 Nippard: Exactly.

7 **Sullivan:** ... you know, and certainly in – in no way shape or form wanted to, you

8 know...

9 Nippard: Yeah.

10 **Sullivan:** ... certainly interfere in anyway or whatever, right. Just again strictly for

11 him.

12 Nippard: Yeah.

13 **Sullivan:** A familiar face means ...

14 Nippard: Exactly.

15 **Sullivan:** ... a lot in times like that, right so.

16 **Nippard:** How long were you with him?

17 **Sullivan:** I would say about two hours I suppose.

18 Nippard: Okay.

19 **Sullivan:** Yeah.

20 **Nippard:** That was all at Holyrood was it?

21 **Sullivan:** Yeah. Yeah.

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1 **Nippard:** Did you give him a ride after?

2 **Sullivan:** I dri – drove home, yeah.

3 Nippard: How ...

4 **Sullivan:** Dropped him off at – at his – right at his – at his doorstep.

5 Nippard: Okay. I know his clothes got taken after. Who – did somebody come and

6 take those ...

7 Sullivan: Yeah.

8 **Nippard:** ... at Holyrood or?

9 **Sullivan:** We had a unit swing by his house.

10 Nippard: Okay.

Sullivan: And, ah, that was – oh jeez, you know what – it might have been – I think

it might have been Rob but I'm not quite sure who came out with

the clothes. But anyway, ah, ...

14 **Nippard:** Okay.

15 **Sullivan:** ... this – his wife prepared the clothes for him. Dropped 'em off. He

changed. Once he was changed the guys said you're done, see you later.

17 **Nippard:** Okay.

So then away we went. The three of us were in one rig. We left and we

came on back to down. And just – lot – like a lot of the conversation then

was, ah, like what to anticipate, you know, and I went through like some of

the things regarding legal representation. If the time ever comes where

you need a lawyer, look – we're gonna look after that. But talked a lot

about, ah, the critical incident part...

24 Nippard: Yeah.

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1 2 3 4	Sullivan:	and – and ensure him that he was gonna be okay. And I said, Joey, not – you might feel okay now, tomorrow, next week but I'm dealing with members now that's ten years after or fifteen, twenty years after incidents they've been involved in. Some are even retired.
5	Nippard:	Yeah.
6 7 8 9 10 11	Sullivan:	And I said, you know what, if we can do the first aid now, you need – you need to do it. And he was totally in agreement to that. And then we talked about – and I – you know, we talked about Fred and, you know, a lot – a lot of stuff, right, that we talked about. But I tried not to – tried not to talk about the incident itself, like get into any details or anything like that. Like I said, even when I dropped him off I didn't even know the guy's
12 13 14		name, right. So and – and pretty much the jest of what I – what I got was what I got when I got in Holyrood. Just a Coles' Notes version of – of what happened.
15	Nippard:	Yeah.
16 17	Sullivan:	Just give us some idea of what – how to prepare or, you know, anything for him, right.
18	Nippard:	Yeah.
19	Sullivan:	So it's – that's pretty much it.
20	Nippard:	Yeah.
21	Sullivan:	Yeah.
22	Nippard:	You need he was on the Premier's Detail I'm assuming
23	Sullivan:	Oh yeah.
24	Nippard:	or you knew(unintel) these
25	Sullivan:	Yeah.

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Nippard: ... you – or I guess – I guess well you guys are – don't have that many

members but I guess you knew him before – before all of this or whatnot.

3 **Sullivan:** Oh absolutely.

4 Nippard: Yeah.

5 Sullivan: Yeah. Like I said, we ...

6 **Nippard:** Yeah.

7 **Sullivan:** ... like I mean, I considered Joey to be a ...

8 Nippard: Yeah.

9 **Sullivan:** ...you know, a – an acquaintance ...

10 **Nippard:** Yeah.

11 **Sullivan:** .. for the most part, you know, to – we were involved in the Police

Association business for – for a couple of years, right, ...

13 **Nippard:** Yeah.

Sullivan: ... together, so we socialized a bit and, you know, so I mean certainly very

familiar with him. You know, we're ...

16 **Nippard:** Yeah.

17 **Sullivan:** ... a close family over there anyway, right.

18 **Nippard:** Exactly. Right. Yeah.

19 **Sullivan:** Yeah. Yeah.

20 **Nippard:** Perfect. Well that's – that's all I can think to ask you, buddy.

21 **Sullivan:** No sweat.
