Nippard:

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All right. It's, ah, Tuesday, April 28th, 1:57. My name is Constable

NIPPARD, and I'm here with Bill JAMES. Is it J-A-M-E-S?

James:

J-A-M-E-S.

Nippard:

All right, and Bill, we're just going to talk about, ah, the first reenactment that was done here with regards to, ah, the shooting incident that took place in Mitchell's Brook. The first reenactment, just to jog your memory, was, ah, took place, um, around one o'clock on April the 8<sup>th</sup>, 2015. That was on a Wednesday. So just tell me everything you can remember about being there and what you seen and...

James:

Ah, essentially, ah, Constable SMYTH contacted me and told me he was going to Mitchell's Brook to, ah, conduct the...the reenactment for the investigation and, ah, I was requested to go along just to, I guess, be a set of eyes and see if there was any issues in relation to training or anything that, you know, was, I guess we could look at for, you know, do we need to change anything, do we need to...was there something done wrong kind of thing, and so, ah, Joe picked me up at Headquarters and we drove out, and we got to Mitchell's Brook and your guys were there. Ah, I got introduced to, I guess, the investigators and, ah, your Ident officer was there and Chief Justice RICH was there as well. I don't remember the names of the officers that were there but, ah, I think there was a guy there from Holyrood GIU. I think he was...

GIS.

GIS?

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Nippard:

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Yeah.

James:

And, you know, ah, we were, you know, I was basically directed to, like, and I had no intentions of, you know, getting involved in anything. I was just there to observe, and that's what my role was and I'm...I'm sure that that's...that's all I did. I didn't...I didn't speak. I didn't interfere, you know. question or anything like that. I was just there, again, to...to observe, ah, so I'm sure that I was out of camera view and all that and, ah, let your guys do...do what they had to do. ah, so I was in the...in the driveway. Ah, Constable SMYTH was hooked up with his microphone, and he went into his, ah. I guess, dealings or actions of the day in guestion. Easter Sunday. Ah, I remember him saying that he stood outside the...the residence and looked in through the, I guess, the living room window, the bay window there and, ah, approached, ah, the front step there. I know that the steps were...I think the first step was a tire, flipped over with the tire rim, and the next step was two cinder blocks with two pieces of plank on it and then you were up on the patio itself. Ah, the patio, ah, led to the front door, and off to the left on the patio there was a great big hold in the patio. I know that because the...the cats were all over the place. They were coming up out of the patio and, ah, so I stood back, and Joe said that, ah, that Mr. DUNPHY had come to the door, ah, asked who he was. Joe identified himself with his...said he had his badge on and his...his ID, and he presented it and showed it to Mr. DUNPHY. Ah. Mr. DUNPHY invited him into the residence. Ah, according to Joe, he went into the residence and they were...conversation back and forth, and my understanding is they went to the...the living room which is, as you go in through the door, it's directly on the right hand side, and if you look down the hall I think it went into the kitchen, and directly on the left hand side when you go in through the door I think there was like a closet or something, and at the end of the hall before you went into the kitchen the hall turned left, and directly off that hall on the left hand side was the washroom, and then there was...there was one or two rooms off the...the back of the residence. Ah, Joe said he went in and spoke to Mr.

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DUNPHY. I'm just trying to remember the layout of the place now. I think 1 as you went in through the...the living room, ah, on the right hand side as 2 you went in through the door there was a chair. I think that's where Mr. 3 DUNPHY was sat, and to the left of the door in the same room there 4 5 another chair and maybe a couch along that same wall, a small coffee table, and on the far wall if you were looking into the living room...living 6 7 room from the hallway, that was the fireplace, and I was out in the hall, and I couldn't see what Joe was saying or doing or whatever but, ah. 8 9 'cause again, ah, Constable LEE I think it was, the Ident officer, she was in the room. She was doing all...doing all the filming so I ensured that I 10 didn't get in the picture, in the frame or in view kind of thing. I believe 11 12 Judge RICH was in the hallway as well. He was making notes, and Joe 13 was going through what transpired and, ah, he, ah, Joe said he...he noticed that there was a bat or a stick or something alongside 14 the...between the chair and the door, had some kind of tape on it. I think 15 he said it might have been like duct tape or something or other on it. He 16 questioned Mr. DUNPHY what the stick was for and his answer was 17 that...Mr. DUNPHY's answer was that, ah, he used it for protection, and 18 that was...that was it and, ah, he, ah, was saying how he, ah, was looking 19 around and Mr. DUNPHY...they had some interaction there and Mr. 20 DUNPHY got upset and then he kind of calmed down and, you know, they 21 spoke for several minutes or whatever and, you know, I don't know if 22 you've been to the residence. I guess you probably have, like, it's...it's 23 not the most ideal living conditions and, ah, Joe was over in...in the back 24 of the room by the fireplace, and he...he said he moved some stuff that 25 was on the floor because there was trash or garbage or junk or whatever 26 in...in the residence and, ah, when he moved it bugs started to move, 27 right? So Joe said to Mr. DUNPHY, I can't remember what his exact 28 words were, but it was something along the lines of, ah, he was concerned 29 for Mr. DUNPHY's wellbeing. I...I'm guessing he's meaning his living 30 31 conditions. And, ah, because, like, I was looking around, like, when I went 32 into the house, like, the smell of the cats was really overpowering and 33 then, like, the wall, there was great big, you know, scabs of paint hanging

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off the wall, and all the mouldings from about two, two and a half feet 1 down were up from the floor were all clawed off by the cats and, ah, the 2 floor was just pressboard and was...it was kind of spongy. I know in the 3 bathroom, like, all the ceiling was let go and the insulation was hanging 4 down through and that looked like it was soaking wet, and the roof was...a 5 tarpaulin was keeping the rain out, and the window...the front window 6 there was, like, a big gap between the windows itself and the house, like, it 7 was, you know, pretty...pretty poor living conditions. But, ah, anyway, Joe 8 9 was saying how, you know, he had concerns for Mr. DUNPHY's, ah, wellbeing, I guess, and ah, Mr. DUNPHY got upset over that and, vou 10 know, then calmed down or what have you, and Joe said that he had, ah, 11 had a file folder with him and he looked at his...he was looking at his 12 notes and, ah, prior to this he...he had said that, ah, you know, Mr. 13 DUNPHY was...wasn't a big man. He was small in stature or whatever 14 and, ah, Joe said, like, even though the stick was there, you know, he 15 didn't feel threatened by Mr. DUNPHY at that point and, you know, even if 16 Mr. DUNPHY had have, you know, used the stick against Joe, ah, he felt 17 that, like, he could have overpowered him with, you know, just using 18 hands on kind of thing or the most he would have probably had to use was 19 probably pepper spray, and so he...he felt, you know, comfortable in the 20 residence with him and, ah, because as Joe said, he was looking at his file 21 22 folder and, ah, he could see Mr. DUNPHY because Joe was over by the fireplace and, you know, I guess in his peripheral vision he could see Mr. 23 DUNPHY sat in the chair and, ah, he looked up and he saw...he said he 24 thought he saw Mr. DUNPHY kind of go from here to rise up out of the 25 chair, and then he saw the rifle or the firearm, ah, pointed in his direction 26 27 and, ah, Joe was saying how he, ah, he saw the firearm and, ah, for whatever reason he was kind of swinging his left hand like he was going to 28 try and, I guess, try and block the bullet or whatever, and he was saying 29 how, you know, he's going to strike me with...with a bullet here now and 30 it's going to either strike me here in the, like, the rib cage or in the side or 31 whatever, and he said that...that's going to hurt, right? And, ah, he said, 32 like, for whatever reason he was, you know, he swept his left hand this 33

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way, and he said he doesn't recall, like, drawing his firearm. He said he doesn't, like, his coat was undone he said and, ah, he can't remember if he swept his coat back or if he brought his hand down and, like, drew his firearm up out of his holster. He said he didn't re...recall, like, unsnapping or anything. It was just so instantaneous he said. I guess his firearm was there and then his...his training kicked in. His firearm was pointed at him. He fired two shots centre mass and that's how we're tr...we're trained and, ah, there was no...no response I...I guess. I don't know what...I guess he was anticipating, you know, Mr. DUNPHY would go flying back across the floor or something, I don't know. But anyway there was...there was no...no response from Mr. DUNPHY then. Again, training, if you fire two rounds, those two rounds are ineffective, you fire the third shot to...to the head. He said he fired the third shot towards, ah, Mr. DUNPHY's head and he said he didn't think that round struck him either, and as he was firing he's, you know, trying to exit the room so he has to I guess close that gap or distance between Mr. DUNPHY and him in order to exit the room because that was his only exit out was through the...that doorway or the archway or go through the plate glass window.

### Nippard:

Yeah.

#### James:

So he dove for the exit and, ah, as he was going by he fired the fourth shot and struck him and he said he recalls. I think he said he struck him, like, somewhere in the side of the head in the temple area, and then he exited the room, but he didn't exit the residence. He was out in the hall and he was, you know, calling out to Mr. DUNPHY, I guess, to put down the weapon, put down the weapon, put down the weapon, and he was I guess in a panic at that point because like he said...he said, you know, he hadn't cleared the house. There was no reason for him to, you know, clear the house kind of thing, so he just then he was thinking, like, is there anybody else in the house. You know, thinking (unintel) one plus one rule so, you know, didn't know if there was somebody else in the house, and then he was thinking, like, you know, the brother was next door who he had visited prior to coming over and...and said now, you know, I'm sure

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that the brother must have heard the...the gun shots or whatever so now 1 is he, you know, coming over to investigate, and is he coming armed and, 2 you know, am I going to be dealing with the brother as well so I guess 3 there's a whole host of things going on in his head and, ah, so as he said 4 he was calling out to Mr. DUNPHY and then he, you know, he started 5 piecing slicing the pie, trying to see what was unfolding in...in the room 6 that he just came out of. Mr. DUNPHY as he went up the hallway towards 7 the room again, because he'd (unintel) him on the floor, and he came 8 around the corner, saw Mr. DUNPHY there, you know, he was kind of sat 9 back in the chair with his head leaned back, and he said that it was quite 10 evident that, you know, he was deceased, but now I think he even said 11 12 that he checked him for a pulse or, you know, checked on him or whatever, then he was thinking, like, you know, is he going to get up 13 again. Just, I guess there was so many things going through his head 14 and, ah, then he, you know, realized that he was...he was deceased and 15 then he started thinking, okay, well, I got to call, so he called the ... called 16 17 the RCMP Telecoms here and told him that he needed...there had been a shooting, ah, he needed response, and he was saying that, ah, I think it 18 was the dispatcher was asking, like, was...was he in need of, you know, 19 20 medical attention or whatever and if he needed a helicopter or medivac or whatever and, ah, he...he said no and he, like, stayed on line for (unintel) 21 and then, ah, I guess, I think he was told that the RCMP from Holyrood 22 were (unintel) kind of thing. So he was there and he was looking around 23 and, you know, looking at DUNPHY and then he went outside...went 24 outside to, I guess to his vehicle, and I think he called... I don't know if he 25 said he called the RCMP or if he...the detachment. I don't think he called 26 the detachment. He called our Comcentre and advised them and, ah, he 27 said there was no one responded, like the brother didn't come from next 28 door or anything like that and, ah, he said the only person he saw was 29 a...a black car went in the road. He said there was a man and a woman 30 in it. They slowed down, kind of looked up the driveway and continued on 31 and, ah, so then he said he...he got in his vehicle and turned on the 32 emergency lights so the responding officers would know or the ambulance 33

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1 2 3 4 5 6	,	or whatever would know where towhere to stop to, and he said while he was in the driveway the vehicle that had gone in the road turned around, came out, again slowed down, looked up the driveway, never spoke to him or anything like that and then kind of continued on out towards Salmonier Line I guess and, ah, your officers, RCMP officers arrived from Holyrood and that was essentially it.
7	Nippard:	Ah, so youhow long have you known Joe?
8	James:	I've known Joe since he came into the -
9	Nippard:	Oh since then.
10	James:	- Constabulary.
11	Nippard:	Okay.
12	James:	Yeah.
13	Nippard:	Ah, do you treaor do you, sorry, teach use of force or?
14	James:	Yes.
15	Nippard:	That'sis that, like, what you do every day or?
16 17	James:	That's what I do right nownow for the last, you know, several years, yeah.
18 19	Nippard:	Oh, okay. Ah, so you, like you said, your role was just that, to get an idea for yourself what happened.
20	James:	Yeah.
21	Nippard:	To see if there was something you could adapt to training.
22 23 24	James:	Yeah, if there was an issue, like, you know, are we, you know doing something wrong or, you know, is there something that we can improve on kind of thing.

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I got you. Ah, how did Joe do overall with the, ah, reenactment, like, how was his emotions when it was happening?

James:

Ah, Joe picked me up at the station and, now I'm called in, you know, I think he had given his statement to your investigators, and I called him I think it was the night after he gave his...his statement just to, you know, how are you doing, how's...how's things kind of thing just, you know, see how he was, see how his family was, and he, you know, he spoke to me, he was best kind and, ah, like I said, he picked me up and he drove out to Mitchell's Brook, and all the way out from town to Mitchell's Brook we're, like, we're talking, like, talking shop and, like, family and vacations and just...just chit-chat and, ah, all along way, like, you know, there was no...nothing, and then as soon as we hit the sign where it says Mitchell's Brook I was talking away to him and, like, I was posing a question to him, like, there was no response when we got in to Mitchell's Brook so I...I kind of felt then that, okay, I left him alone for a little bit and that's, you know, I posed another question to him, and I said to him, I said you okay? And he said, yeah, he said, I'm okay. He said, it's just a...a little...getting a little surreal here now, right? And, ah, I said 'cause, you know, nothing says that you have to do this today. I said, like, you know, you do it when you're...you're ready and you're comfortable or...he said, no, no, I'm good, and he said I'll...I'll be fine and, ah, so we continued on and, ah, again we got...we stopped in front of the residence and got out and did the introductions and what have you, and then, ah, he was hooked up to his mike and he started to do his reenactment, and as soon as he got in through the door into the threshold of the residence it was like there was a pause again, and I think one of your investigators said, like, are you okay, like, good...okay to do this kind of thing. He said, yeah, he said, it's just that, ah, the...the odor is really, like, I guess, drawing him back to that day. Well, you know, scents is one of the, ah, the...really heightened in a, you know, stressful situation reenactment kind of thing and, ah, so he said, no, he said, I'm good. Just give me a second and, ah, you know, he took a breath and took, you know, a few seconds and then continued on

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1		with hiswhat transpired on Easter Sunday, and then coming back, you
2		know, I asked him, I said, how do you feel about it? He said III'm
3		good now. I'm glad it's done. He said, like, just getting into the residence
4		there, he said, like, the smell of thethe odor of cats was pretty
5		overoverpowering, and it was, like, there wasI think there was like
. 6		forty cats there and they were all over the place and some of them
7		weresome had mange and some wereI think there was an eye
8		hanging out on one, like, it was just a mess. There was a great big pile of
.9		cat food in the hall, right? It wasn't in a bowl or anything, just piled in the
10		hall. There was another big pile of it in the back porch, the kitchen, it was
11		likeit was unfortunate to, you know, the circumstances this gentleman
12		was living in.
13	Nippard:	Yeah.
14	James:	It was. Other than that, like, hehe seemed best kind.
15	Nippard:	So you do recall, like, you said you do recall a member of the RCMP being
16		there and videotaping it –
17	James:	Yes.
18	Nippard:	- and whatnot.
19	James:	I think it was, ah, I think her name was KristaKrista LEE Ithink?
20	Nippard:	Kelly LEE.
21	James:	Kelly LEE, yeah. Yes.
22	Nippard:	Ah, did anywhowho spoke in the house during it all happening? Was
23		it only Joe and Steve or was it only Joe or? I wasn't there.

22		you, Steve and Joe there, and Kelly and Dion and Judge RICH, ah, do you
23		remember anybody, you know, even accidentally hitting anything or
24		moving anything, you know, I'm just

26	Nippard:	A lot of people in a small space.

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James: And, ah, I just sat in his car for...for a second and, ah, and he asked how 1

Joe was doing and that and I was basically reiterating that when we got to 2

Mitchell's Brook he was a little...little guiet there but, like, he seemed to be 3

best kind and, you know, they were ready to go.

Nippard: 5 Okay.

I stepped out of the car and walked up the driveway behind -James: 6

Nippard: Okay. 7

I kept my distance but, ah, the officer I was talking to in the car stayed in James: 8

the car. He didn't -9

Nippard: Okay. 10

James: - come up to the scene. 11

Nippard: Was he a younger fellow or...? 12

James: 13 He was an older fellow.

Nippard: Older fellow? 14

James: Yeah, like me. 15

Nippard: Okay. Probably Kent OSMOND downstairs I would think. 16

James: Probably, I don't know. 17

18 Nippard: Gray hair?

19 James: Yeah.

Nippard: Yeah, okay. 20

James: Yeah. 21

Nippard: Very good, sir. Well, that's all I can think to ask you. It's 2:19. 22
